WHAT IS GERONTOLOGY?

Gerontology is the study of longevity. Students of gerontology study not only physiological changes that occur with aging, but also social roles, normative expectations, attitudes and beliefs, stereotypes, and policy, health and economic issues which define the aging experience.

HOW DOES GERONTOLOGY COMPLEMENT MY COMMUNICATION STUDIES DEGREE?

Communication in health and aging contexts is a growing speciality in the field of Communication Studies. Communication and information regarding aging issues- with friends, family, providers, and via media and marketing messages- is pervasive and affects all of us, either as patients/ consumers, family members, or message providers. It is important to look at the communication-related health and social issues facing people as we transition through middle life, older age, and end of life; and to understand the aging process as it is shaped by several social, cultural, and interpersonal factors. A minor in Gerontology will give Health Communication students insight into how meaning is constructed in life experiences throughout the life course and will enable students to shape their major in a career in this specific context.
